How to Play

The new Trivioku puzzle combines the logical challenge of a sudoku puzzle with the fun of a general knowledge quiz!

Each square of the grid must contain one of nine different letters – as with sudoku, each letter appears only once in each 3x3 square, each horizontal line and each vertical line, so you can use the given letters to help deduce where the rest go.

Each answer to the trivia quiz contains **ONLY** those letters (the length of the word or words is given in brackets). No letter is used more than once in any particular answer.

The first letter of each answer to questions 1-9 is different in each case, giving you all the letters used in the puzzle.

HINT: The answer to Question 10 contains all nine letters – if you're stuck, that answer fits across the middle of the whole grid!

1. What's the Scottish and Irish equivalent of 'cheers'? (7)
2. Which Greek hero – one of the Argonauts and the father of Ajax – shared his name with a battle between the Romans and the Gauls? (7)
3. Name the Scottish island, famous for its abbey, where the Book of Kells is believed to have been produced. (4)
4. Tallinn is the capital city of which country? (7)
5. Which saint was Archbishop of Canterbury during the turn of the 12th century? (6)
6. Which French city is famous for a motor race founded in 1923? (2,4)
7. Denmark, Italy and Portugal are founder members of which defensive alliance? (4)
8. What's the surname of the Antarctic explorer whose last known words were "I am just going outside and may be some time"? (5)
9. Name the service of prayer celebrated at daybreak by some monastic communities. (6)
10. Which patron of sailors has a luminescent weather phenomenon named after him? (5,4)
